# **Vermont National Guard Members:** You must be a "**Veteran**" as defined in **38 U.S.C.** to qualify.

#### **Registration**

Upon proper application, the Commissioner of Motor Vehicles shall issue special plates to Vermont veterans, as defined in <u>38 U.S.C. § 101(10)</u>, and to members of the U.S. Armed Forces, as defined in <u>38 U.S.C. § 101(10)</u>. The plates shall be reissued only to the original holder of the plates or the <u>surviving spouse</u>.

The Office of Veterans Affairs will return the completed application with Veteran certification to you if your registration expires soon. Otherwise, the Office of Veterans Affairs will forward the application to DMV. Once you have received the returned application, bring this application to a DMV office or mail the application to the DMV. Be sure also to have your renewal notice or new registration application.

If this is a <u>new or transfer registration</u>, form VD-119, Vermont Registration, Tax & Title Application must also be submitted along with the required fees. If <u>renewing registration</u>, include the renewal notice. A <u>disabled plate</u> requires additional verification AND completed DMV form VS-113 (unless you already have a disabled plate or parking placard).

### **License & Non-Driver** Identification cards

If a veteran, as defined in 38 U.S.C. § 101(2), requests a veteran designation and the Office of Veterans Affairs confirms his or her status as an honorably discharged veteran, the license or Non-Driver ID certificate shall include the term "veteran" on its face.

This application must be submitted with the appropriate license application and fees. If a renewal, include a license renewal notice. If not a renewal (or renewal notice is unavailable), use form VL-021 for Driver's License or form VL-031 for CDL.

The Office of Veterans Affairs will return the completed application with Veteran certification to you if your license expires soon. Otherwise, the Office of Veterans Affairs will forward the application to DMV. Once you have received the returned application, bring this application to a DMV office or mail the application to the DMV. Be sure also to have your renewal notice or new license application.

### 38 U.S.C. § 101

- (2) The term "veteran" means a person who served in the active military, naval, or air service, and who was discharged or released therefrom under conditions other than dishonorable.
- (3) The term "surviving spouse" means...a person...who was the spouse of a veteran at the time of the veteran's death, and who lived with the veteran continuously from the date of marriage to the date of the veteran's death...and who has not remarried....

**NOTE:** Surviving Spouse may only be **reissued** an existing plate.
