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Available ID types:

- Real ID: A Real ID card meets Federal standards for issuance. Real ID is required for flying on commercial aircraft and to access certain federally controlled facilities (federal courts, federal buildings, military bases).
- <u>Privilege Card (DPC)</u>: A DPC is marked "Not for Federal Identification" and is NOT Real ID compliant. Issuance of the DPC does not require proof of legal presence or US citizenship.
- Enhanced (EDL): An EDL is a Real ID compliant card with the added benefit of being a convenient border crossing document for U.S. citizens returning home from Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean or Bermuda, by land or sea. Must be Vermont resident AND U.S. Citizen.

NOTE: All original issue (first time) ID Cards must be applied for in-person at a DMV office. The application must bear the personal signature of the applicant, and the signature must be in ink. If the applicant is under age 18, the written consent of the applicant's parent, legal guardian, or other person standing in loco parentis will be required.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

New applicants and customers making changes to name, date of birth, place of birth or SSN must present the required documents from each of these four categories. Not required for renewals with no changes to name, DOB, POB or SSN.

- 1. **Identity and date of birth -** Must provide **one** of the following:
 - Valid, unexpired passport,
 - Certified record of the applicant's birth, marriage, adoption, or divorce, including a translation if necessary
 - Consular Report of Birth Abroad (CRBA) issued by the U.S. Department of State (Form FS-240, DS-1350 or FS-545)
 - Valid consular identification document issued by the government of Mexico, Guatemala (or any other government with comparable security standards and protocols, as determined by the Commissioner)
- Valid, unexpired Permanent Resident Card (Form I-551)
- Certificate of Naturalization issued by DHS (Form N-550 or Form N-570)
- Certificate of Citizenship (Form N-560 or Form N-561) issued by DHS
- Real ID Driver's License or Identification Card issued in compliance with the standards established by <u>6 CFR part 37</u>.
- 2. **Social Security Information** You must present your Social Security card or a letter from the Social Security Administration indicating your ineligibility to receive a Social Security number (SSN).

If your Social Security card is not available, one of the following forms may be used in its place: W-2 form, SSA-1099 form, pay stub showing name and SSN (minimum of last four digits) (Your name must verify with Social Security Administration). If there have been multiple changes to your name, you must provide documentation to prove the continuity of the names. For example marriage or civil union certificate (a certified copy issued by town/city), marriage or civil union dissolution, or probate court name change document.)

3. **Vermont residency and current residential address** - You must present **two** documents that include your name and current Vermont residential address that demonstrate residency in the state of Vermont.

Examples include:

- piece of mail with current name and Vermont street address including city/town (no P.O. Boxes),
- utility bill (must list service address),
- property tax bill with a physical location,

- signed lease,
- Homeowners/renters insurance (policy/proof of claim),
- Vermont EBT or Vermont AIM identification card,
- Vermont Residency Certification.
- 4. Lawful status in the United States (Only required for Real ID & EDL) In most cases, the documents required for proof of identity and date of birth will also establish lawful status in the United States. Foreign nationals must provide a passport and visa, alien registration receipt card (green card), or other proof of legal presence for inspection and copying.

ENHANCED (EDL)

In addition to the above documents, an EDL requires proof of US Citizenship.

- Original certified birth certificate issued by a government unit in the U.S. or U.S. territory.
- Valid, unexpired U.S. passport or passport card.

- Certificate of Citizenship (N-560 or N-561). Certificate of Naturalization (N-550, N-570 or N-578).
- Consular Report of Birth Abroad issued by the U.S. Department of State (FS-240, DS-1350 or FS-545).

<u>FEES</u>

- Non-Driver ID, New/Renew \$29.00
- Non-Driver ID, Replacement \$24.00
- Non-Driver ID, SSI Reduced Fee \$10.00
- Enhanced Fee Additional \$36.00

SSI/SSD Reduced Fees (Non-Driver ID only): An individual who is currently on Supplemental Security Income (SSI) or Social Security Disability (SSD) is eligible for a reduced fee for a Non-Driver ID. Proof of SSI or SSD is required at the time of the service. This can be done by submitting a benefit verification letter to this Department. A copy of the benefit verification letter can be obtained by contacting Social Security by phone, mail or in person.

REGISTER TO VOTE

If you are eligible, today you will be registered to vote unless you decline. You are eligible to vote in the town or city where you physically reside if as of Election Day, you:

- are a United States citizen
- are a resident of Vermont

- are 18 years old
- take Voter's Oath.

You are a "resident" under Vermont law if you are domiciled in the town as evidenced by intent to maintain a principal dwelling place in the town indefinitely and to return there if temporarily absent, coupled with an act or acts consistent with that intent.

You only need to take the Voter's Oath once. If you were previously registered to vote in Vermont you have already taken the Voter's Oath. You can attest that you have taken the voter's oath for yourself or a DMV employee can administer the Voter's Oath to you.

You are not officially registered to vote until your Town or City Clerk reviews your application to be sure that you meet all eligibility requirements. The Clerk will notify you in writing if your application is approved and notify you of the location of your polling place. If your application is denied, the Clerk will notify you explaining why you are not eligible and also explain how you can file an appeal to the Board of Civil Authority in your Town or City.
